# RESOLUTION NO. 24-87 OF THE OMAHA TRIBE OF NEBRASKA

RE: A21AV1022 ARPA HIP MODIFICATION OF SCOPE OF WORK & BUDGET & EXTENSION

- WHEREAS: The Omaha Tribe of Nebraska is a federally recognized Indian tribe, organized under a constitution and bylaws approved by the Secretary of Interior on April 30, 1936, pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934; and
- WHEREAS: pursuant to Article III, Sec.1 of the constitution of the Omaha Tribe of Nebraska, the governing body of the Omaha Tribe shall also be known as Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS: Article IV, Section 1 (j) of the Constitution of the Omaha Tribe of Nebraska provides the Omaha Tribal Council with the power to safeguard and promote the economy and general welfare of the Omaha Tribe; and
- WHEREAS: The Omaha Tribe of Nebraska was awarded \$230,564 to assist eligible tribal members with essential home weatherization projects. Due to the increase in cost of materials, the Omaha Tribe prepared a change in the scope of work and budget to allow for a maximum of \$10,000 per household for weatherization repairs.
- WHEREAS: The Omaha Tribe of Nebraska was unable to complete the project in the time allotted due to a shortage of available contractors due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. The Omaha Tribal Council is requesting an extension of the period of performance to allow for adequate time to complete the Home Improvements.
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The Omaha Tribal Council adopts the policy and procedures for the ARPA Home Improvement Program, the updated scope of work and budget to address current market costs. The Omaha Tribe also requests an extension of the period of performance to December 31, 2024 to allow for adequate time to complete the project.

## American Rescue Plan Act

Home Improvement Program Policy

The Omaha Tribe (Tribe) was awarded \$230,564 through the American Rescue Plan Act-Housing Improvement Program (HIP), administered through the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act, P.L. 93-638, 25 CFR Part 900. Through the HIP, the Omaha Tribe will assist eligible tribal citizens through the Housing Improvement Program. The Housing Improvement Program allow tribal citizens to stay in their homes safely during the COVID-19 pandemic.

There are two categories of available assistance. An applicant may choose one of the following programs:

- Window Replacement Program: This program will replace existing windows in the home with those intended for winter weather. This will keep homes warm and habitable during winter months as well as lower the cost of heating for tribal members.
- Home Skirting and Heat Wrapping Program: This program supports Omaha citizens that need
  crucial skirting and water pipe heat-wrapping to improve living conditions in the home. This
  project will significantly reduce the freezing of pipes during winter months.

## Eligibility:

To qualify for the Omaha Tribe's Housing Improvement Program, the applicant must be an enrolled citizen of the Omaha Tribe. An eligible person may be a homeowner or renter. All Omaha tribal members are eligible for both the Window Replacement and Home Skirting and Heat Wrapping Program so long as they live within the service area of the Omaha Tribe.

## **Application Requirements:**

To apply for Omaha's Housing Improvement Program, all applicants must submit all of the following documents:

- 1. Fully Completed Housing Improvement Application Form.
- 2. Verified tribal enrollment (active Tribal ID or enrollment number).
- 3. Statement that the home is the tribal citizen's primary residence.
- 4. Proof of home ownership (i.e., mortgage deed) or a rental agreement.

Deadline to Apply: September 1, 2024.

#### Fair and Uniform Services

The Omaha Tribe shall provide services under this Contract in a fair and uniform manner and shall provide access to an administrative or judicial body empowered to adjudicate or otherwise resolve complaints claims, and grievances brought by program beneficiaries against the Omaha Tribe arising out of the performance of the Contract.

## Appeal Process

Community members that are dissatisfied with any decision made by ARPA Director can give their written concern/complaint to the Chief Tribal Officer within 10 working days of the decision. The CTO will gather all pertinent information to investigate the matter. The CTO will issue a written decision within 10 working days of receipt of appeal.

G. A brief statement of the programs, functions, services, or activities that the tribal organization proposes to perform, including:

The Omaha Tribe (Tribe) was awarded \$230,564 through the American Rescue Plan Act-Housing Improvement Program (HIP), administered through the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act, P.L. 93-638, 25 CFR Part 900. Through the HIP, the Tribe will assist eligible tribal citizens with home repairs as it relates to weatherization of the home. The Housing Improvement Program will allow tribal citizens to stay in their homes safely during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Specifically, projects under the Omaha Tribe's Housing Improvement Program will relate to weatherization of homes. The Omaha Tribe lies within both Nebraska and lowa. During the winter months, temperatures in this region can dip well below 0° F. In addition to inclement winter weather, many Omaha Tribal Members live in old, cheap, or otherwise dilapidated homes. The conjunction of both of these conditions has led to unsafe living conditions for tribal members.

Eligible tribal members will have the option to choose one of two Housing Improvement Projects: 1} Window Replacement, or; 2) skirting replacement and heat wrap for pipes under the home.

The urgency to improve these homes has been significantly increased due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Tribal members have been asked to stay home to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 beginning in the spring of 2020. Some tribal members live in conditions that do not allow them to safely quarantine, and therefore risk contraction of COVID-19. Improving such homes allows the Omaha Tribe to improve living conditions of tribal members, as well as limits the spread of COVID-19 by displaced tribal members

The Omaha Tribe was awarded \$230,564. The maximum repairs or renovations shall not exceed \$107,000 for any one dwelling. Therefore, the number of tribal members who will receive benefits from this contract is estimated at 2332.

**Processing Applications:** 

Once the Omaha Tribe's <u>ARPAHousing</u> Director receives the Housing Improvement Program Application Form (Document 2), the review process will begin to determine the applicant's eligibility. The Housing Director will rate the eligible applications and assign numeric values according to the Tribe's priority list; using the Housing Improvement Program Applicant Ranking Tool (Document 3-Applicant Database Tab). In case of a tie, the tiebreaker will be based on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Once an applicant is selected, the <u>ARPAHousing</u> Director will create a case file for the tribal citizen and begin the scope of work according to the application:

The <u>ARPAHousing</u> Director will prepare a scope of work, schedule a contractor, and a cost estimate for the windows/skirting/heat wrap. The tribal citizen will be asked to concur with the scheduled work by signing a copy of the notice. Once the copy of the notice is signed, the project can proceed with contracting. The Tribe will be responsible for obtaining quotes and bids within a timely manner consistent with <u>Procurement Policies and Procedures</u> and approving payments upon completion of the project. Upon completion of the project, the tribal citizen must sign a Housing Improvement Program-Certification of Final Completion Form (Document 4).
