RESOLUTION NO. 25-63

OF THE

OMAHA TRIBE OF NEBRASKA

RE: Response to Proposed Research Project by UNMC College of Nursing Researcher, Brandon Varilek

- WHEREAS: The Omaha Tribe of Nebraska is a federally recognized Indian tribe, organized under a constitution and bylaws approved by the Secretary of Interior on April 30, 1936, pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934; and
- **WHEREAS:** pursuant to Article III, Sec.1 of the constitution of the Omaha Tribe of Nebraska, the governing body of the Omaha Tribe shall also be known as Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS: Article IV, Section 1 (j) of the Constitution of the Omaha Tribe of Nebraska provides the Omaha Tribal Council with the power to safeguard and promote the economy and general welfare of the Omaha Tribe; and
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: the Omaha Tribal Council supports the submission of the NIH Grant Proposal titled: "Co-Creating and Testing a Palliative Care Intervention with Rural American Indian/Alaska Native Persons with End-Stage Kidney Disease"; and,
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** that the Omaha Tribal Council finds this work to be beneficial to persons with end-stage kidney disease who are receiving dialysis treatments and for their loved ones who provide care and assistance; and
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** that the following requirements be met upon successful funding of the grant application:
 - 1. Prior to any work being carried out with the Omaha Tribe, the project must undergo review through the Tribal Council and the Indian Health Service Research Review Board.
 - 2. Upon council and Research Review Board approval of your research, your collaboration with the Carl T. Curtis Health Education Center may proceed.
 - 3. Your work must abide by all conditions of approval outlined in the approval, such as terms of the use of data and any other stipulations provided.
 - 4. After the initial approval, you must report any modifications to your research plans to the Tribal Council and Research Review Board for approval prior to implementing the changes.

- 5. You are required to obtain a continuing review of your research every year for the duration of the project.
- 6. Additional stipulations include: any data produced from research conducted is owned and retained by the Omaha Tribe but may be used by you in relevant publications and/or research articles; any data produced from the research conducted may also be used in new research that arises out of the work done through this grant and relevant to the topic.
